## **Schools Cricket**



Our **Chance to Shine** (CTS) and **Champion Schools Programme** continues across the county with Ledbury, Eastnor, Walford, Weobley, Almeley, St James and St Martins all benefitting. The programme will continue to gather pace as we head into spring with more schools taking part and signposting to local clubs.

Pete Gale is enabling primary schools to develop closer links with their feeder secondary school through cricket. Weobley High and Weobley Primary are going to be working together on our 'Conveyor Belt Programme' project where we ensure the schools are receiving our support with staff CPD and coaching of pupils from KS1 (yr 2) through to end of KS4 (yr 11). The outcome of this should be more players entering club cricket locally, and hopefully more pupils from the Weobley centre playing for Herefordshire. This is a model we will expand on in 2024 and 2025 with Leominster and Ross schools.

Our "Girls Leadership Project" at St Mary's RC High has been a huge success so far. We are developing the female coaches of tomorrow and also unearthing genuine cricketing talent. Many of the participants have signed up to be part of the softball **bonanza** at Bartestree and Lugwardine CC. We will be beginning a replica of this programme at Whitecross High School after the half term break.


