The season is now five to six weeks in and at last the weather has improved. Hopefully all clubs playing in the different leagues around the county can look forward to a run of games and we will be watching with great interest how the former Marches League Clubs progress in the Worcestershire County Cricket League in 2023.

By now all clubs should have received correspondence regarding club visits by myself and/or other members of the HCL staff as outlined at the Spring Club Engagement meetings held at Ledbury CC and Pentland Gardens. If you haven't seen those emails then please get in contact with your Chair, Secretary or Junior Co-Ordinator to see the news. In essence we are offering to come and visit you on a club night with the intention of both listening and discussing where you are as a club and what bespoke support that you might need.

Also, we have detailed to you the ECB finances that are available through the ECB County Grant Fund programme and are able to advise on, safeguarding, coach development, women and girls, Clubmark and development planning as part of our visit. Already a handful of clubs have benefited from a visit generating bespoke advice and a greater connection between HCL and our clubs, so please get in touch if you feel you need any help or advice.

Herefordshire Affiliated Clubs #RewardandRecognition

Quietly behind the scenes we have been working on a ticketing programme for you with **Worcestershire County Cricket Club for the 2023 season**. On doing some analysis of the 2022 season we noted that Herefordians don't directly associate themselves with New Rd and indeed more tickets were purchased for Edgbaston than New Rd last season. We wanted to redress this and be closer to our neighbours.

Our connections through my colleague Richard Cox and the Commercial Department offices at New Rd have led us to the following offer for you.

The deal between Herefordshire Cricket and Worcestershire Cricket allows for **10 Free Tickets for Affiliated HCL Club** (please note you must have paid your 2023 affiliation to HCL before you can access this offer – otherwise you will be rejected by WCCC on application).

These should be used to reward and recognise any groups/individuals you feel merit the opportunity to visit New Road to watch a LV=Insurance County Championship cricket Or Vitality Blast (Non-Friday fixtures only) or One Day Cup.

In order to access the 10 tickets, you will need to email <u>hosting@wccc.co.uk</u> to access the tickets itemising the following –

Your club, the fixture, quantity and destination(email address) of tickets and WCCC will fulfil from the ticket office. You may also need to code - **HCCC/CHAMP23** if you are applying for LV Champ matches.

Juniors in Open Age Cricket

With the season in full swing, we know that many juniors will be asked to play in senior sides for the first time. Making the step up from junior to open age group cricket is an important event in any player's cricket experience. The player's safety, personal development needs and overall cricket experience must be considered.

Clubs, squad coaches and managers must take into account the requirements on age detailed in the guidance <u>here</u>. Juniors should be involved in all aspects of the game wherever possible i.e. socialising, team talks, practice, decision making and so on, so they feel part of the team.

Herefordshire beat Cornwall in



HEREFORDSHIRE got their first win on the board in the NCCA T20 group stages with a thrilling four-run victory over Cornwall at Werrington.

The win evened things up on the day after the hosts edged home by four wickets with eight balls to spare in the first encounter. Herefordshire's success came in a thrilling clash where all results were possible when the final ball was bowled by James Rudge.

After losing the toss and being invited to bat first, Herefordshire made a flying start with Ollie Walker (44) in particularly good form in an opening stand of 71 with skipper Matt Pardoe.

Walker smashed four fours and three sixes from 30 balls before being dismissed by the first ball of the ninth over. After that, the innings lost its way a little, although Pardoe (13), debutant Ollie Hallion (12) and Rudge (15) all reached double figures.

All of the lower order found the seam bowling of Dan Lello problematic as he took a hat-trick on his way to a return of 5-17. Romesh Venkataraman made an early breakthrough in the Cornwall response on his way to excellent figures of 2-8 from four overs – his second fine stint of the double-header after taking 3-8 in his four-over stint the first time around.

But skipper Paul Smith (40) and Will McVicar (24) kept Cornwall in with a chance as they progressed to 91-2. Rudge (2-27), Zak Abbas (2-28) and Adam Hines (1-17) held their collective nerve, however, to guide Herefordshire home. In the first game, Herefordshire struggled to force the pace on a challenging pitch.

Callum Bennett (28), Hallion (20) and Pardoe (13) all got starts but it was clear that Herefordshire would have to bowl exceptionally well if they were to defend their total of Cornwall reached their target with eight balls to spare and four wickets in hand.

The previous day, in an ironic twist of fate considering that Devon had declared a hosepipe ban earlier in the week, both clashes at Sandford against the south-west county were called off due to a wet pitch.
