This programme is enabling many primary age children to engage with cricket that usually wouldn't have the opportunity.

Natasha Exley from Kingstone Academy has been instrumental in helping create our first primary cluster indoor cricket group. The sessions have been hosted by Kingstone High School with the support of Dan Thomas. Tash said "The girls are having a great time playing and I feel it's going really well!". This last three weeks has been a girls only programme with a boy's programme starting in two weeks' time. Twenty-five girls have taken part in this new initiative and we are hopeful that we can grow the programme with other clusters over the coming months.

### **Community Cricket**



#### Herefordshire Cricket Ltd are part of the Lords Taverner's (LT) Kit Recycling Scheme. For 2024 we need your unwanted Cricket Equipment

Last year LT gathered donations from across the UK via hubs, like Herefordshire Cricket and from other sources and organisations, and together they have helped submit donations totalling 17.5 tonnes during 2022/23. This is an increase of 30% over the previous year.

Alongside the programme's aim of collecting and redistributing useful cricket kit, they have also kept records of the impact on the environment, down to each county and in some areas, by organisation. Through their collaboration with the University of the Creative Arts they hope to develop an environmental impact calculator to monitor progress and improve processes.

During the past year they have fulfilled 38 donations, which was evenly split between the UK and overseas. They shipped out just over 12 tonnes of donations, totalling just over 37 thousand items. In the UK they sent donations to cricket clubs, colleges, and world, including Kenya, Zambia, Ghana, Nigeria, Zanzibar, Rwanda, Turkey, Pakistan, and Brazil. These organisations again required infrastructure for their young people development programs, with over half of them requesting equipment for young women.

This coming year they are concentrating on replenishing their stock levels of cricket equipment, so they can continue to support young people from developing cricket nations. Please contact <u>Kirsty Sockett</u> for information on how you can donate.

<u>easyfundraising.org.uk</u> allows your club to raise unlimited funds, simply from online shopping. It is the UK's leading good-cause shopping site and gives your members and supporters a free way of generating money for your club. More than 1,700 clubs have registered with the site to date, raising over £290,000 in free donations.

#### Getting started with easyfundraising

- 1. Register your club
- 2. Search for a retailer you'd like to shop with, such as M&S, John Lewis and Tesco. The retailer will make a donation to your club as a thank you for shopping with them.
- 3. Ask club members to help you raise money by signing up to support your easyfundraising page. Once you've registered your club, you'll have your own
